## ORGANIZATIONAL DEVELOPMENT & LEADERSHIP TRAINING

Our leadership development and organizational systems program in Brazil continues to grow as a model for community transformation. We are helping local organizations to apply values-based, adaptive leadership principles, development strategies, operational rhythms and ways to measure progress. These practices strengthen their effectiveness and resilience through the inevitable challenges of long-term development.

#### **Adaptive Leadership Workshops**

This quarter, our ongoing workshop series included three key modules designed to strengthen leadership capacity and team collaboration:

- **Workshop 1:** Explored unique leadership styles, building high-performing teams, and navigating conflict with confidence.
- Workshop 2: Focused on vision and alignment, how to set priorities, dream big, and move forward together with clarity.
- **Workshop 3:** Centered on self-awareness as the foundation for mutual awareness and stronger relationships within teams.



Our workshops are interactive and experiential, weaving in activities, reflection, and play. Science shows that play fosters emotional resilience, creativity, and problem-solving—essential qualities for leaders working in challenging contexts.

Leadership training doesn't have to mean lectures, it means engagement, practice, and transformation.



# **Community Impact Through Jiu Jitsu**

These community-based jiu jitsu programs go far beyond physical training. They cultivate essential life skills such as discipline, perseverance, self-awareness, and confidence, while creating safe, supportive spaces where connection, belonging, and mentorship take place.

#### Highlights from This Quarter:

- Candeias Bilingual Jiu Jitsu Program:
   Americans and Brazilians train side by side,
   breaking cultural barriers and building mutual understanding. Tony, DreamRoot's Programs Director, leads the classes and is equipping a team of local instructors and coaches to carry the program forward.
- Jiu Jitsu Leadership Network Trainings: Two events brought together multiple BJJ programs across Recife to train, connect, and grow as a unified network.
- Fortaleza Outreach: Our Programs Director, Tony Passos, led a leadership development session and workshop in Fortaleza, training local leaders in personal growth, teaching, and program management.
- Women's Self-Defense Workshop: Hosted at the Arte Suave DreamRoot Training Center, this capacity-building event empowered 19 women with practical safety and prevention skills, creating ripple effects that strengthen families and communities.





 Ongoing Classes: Both the Arte Suave and Sertão DreamRoot Training Centers continue their weekly sessions, with students making tremendous strides in skill, confidence, and character.





#### **Gi Drive Update**

Earlier this year, in collaboration with the Team Passos Jiu Jitsu community, DreamRoot shipped 155 gis and belts to students across West Africa in partnership with Go! International, and the Lionheart MMA Initiative. This gear is now in the hands of young athletes who are training, learning, and growing.

One of the recipients was Karam Initaitive in Ivory Coast, which teaches Jiu Jitsu to local students. They've partnered with HubCity WoeLabs, an organization that teaches coding and IT skills. At their shared space, students spend part of the day in coding classes and then finish with BJJ. Building focus, problem-solving, and resilience in both disciplines.

We are proud of this community for making an impact and helping unlock opportunities for students both on and off the mats. Thank you for being part of this story!

# EDUCATIONAL IMPACT IN HAITI

The team in Haiti celebrated an incredible milestone year, a testament to the dedication and perseverance of their teachers, tutors, and local leaders in partnership with the DreamRoot Tutoring Program at the DreamRoot Resource Center.

This year's results speak for themselves:

- 320 learners in grades 1-9 participated
- 90% pass rate across all grade levels
- 100% success rate on national exams officially earning the school national recognition

This achievement marks a historic first for the program and a major step toward sustainable educational transformation. Congratulations to local leaders Rose and David and their dedicated teaching team for their leadership and perseverance!









### WOMEN'S ENTREPRENEURIAL TRAINING

We launched the 2025 FLAME Entrepreneurial Training Cohort, a hands-on, immersive program for 15 women entrepreneurs in Brazil designed to blend business strategy with purpose-driven leadership. This launch represents a major step forward in equipping women to lead purpose-driven businesses that create mutual value for people, place, and planet.

The event was filled with energy, learning, and genuine connection. Hearing participants share how refreshing and eye-opening it was to approach business and entrepreneurship from a personally calling and mutual value creation perspective was deeply rewarding.





Many expressed how this shift in thinking brought new clarity and confidence as they took tangible steps forward in their ventures, developing business models that not only grow financially, but also foster human and community flourishing.

We kept the training interactive, hands-on, and collaborative. From group discussions over a shared potluck meal to engaging in LEGO® Serious Play® exercises that sparked creativity and innovation, the atmosphere was alive with ideas and encouragement. Participants also explored the BlueCanvas business model tool, developed by our partners at Bluefields Accelerator, which helped them clarify their strategies, refine their market positioning, and align their vision with purposedriven impact.

Already, these women are carrying forward what they've learned—supporting one another, sharing resources, and multiplying impact beyond the training. We're deeply grateful to walk alongside this inspiring group whose perseverance, humility, and courage continue to inspire us daily.
